LABTS held its 39<sup>th</sup> Commencement Exercise on May 18 at 3:00 p.m. An overflow audience filled the chapel and rejoiced with 16 graduates who completed their course of study. God's faithfulness was evident as three students received the Bible Merit Certificate and thirteen earned the standard Bible Diploma.

The faculty and graduates entered the sanctuary to the tune of "God of Our Fathers". The congregation then sang "To God Be The Glory" with the desire that the graduation would bring glory and honor to our great God. Dr. Paul Thorsell read the Scripture and Rev. Anthony Kidd led in prayer. A special selection, "Ordinary People," was sung by Mrs. Ruth Davis. The song reminded each graduate that it is ordinary people that God uses to carry out his work in the world.

The graduation speaker was Dr. Irvin Busenitz, who is the Vice-President for Academic Administration and Professor of Bible Exposition and Old Testament at The Master's Seminary. Dr. Busenitz challenged the gradu-

## **Harvest Banquet 2003**

Once again, the Los Angeles Bible Training School and its Alumni Association is co-sponsoring the annual Harvest Banquet. The banquet will be held on Friday, October 24, at 6:30 p.m., at The Proud Bird Restaurant in Los Angeles.

The speaker for the occasion will be Dr. William L. Banks. Dr. Banks received his undergraduate degree from the University of Pennsylvania and prepared for the ministry by earning degrees from Lincoln Seminary and Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Not only has he served as a pastor, but his ministry consisted of teaching at Moody Bible Institute and Manna Bible Institute. Banks is the author of numerous articles and has written several books. Some of the books that he has authored are: *Jonah, the Reluctant Prophet; The Black Church in the U.S.; Daily Manna; In Search of the Great Commission; The Bible and Black Slavery in the U.S.* Dr. Banks recently penned his autobiography – *The Good Hand of the Lord*.



Dr. Ronald E. Roberts, pastor of Baldwin Hills Baptist Church in Los Angeles, had this to say about the scheduled speaker. "William L. Banks would best be described as a 'seasoned' black evangelical. He is a man of maturity and of great wisdom. It is this writer's conviction, and has been so for many years, that Banks has never received the recognition that he deserves as a pioneer in black evangelicalism. He was an active black evangelical when many of those who are now on the scene did not know the meaning of the phrase

'black evangelical.' . . . It is this author's opinion that William L. Banks stands in the forefront of black evangelical leadership".
