#### A RICH TRADITION

LABTS has been wonderfully blessed by God from its initial days when God brought the late Reverend Jeremiah C. H. Rowe into personal contact with the late Dr. J. Vernon McGee, the noted pastor and radio Bible teacher. Subsequent to their meeting, a fully organized evening school began functioning in

the fall of 1962, with a board of directors, a president, and a gifted teaching staff.

One of the first brochures produced by the school advertised LABTS as a proving ground for worldwide gospel ministries. The school has served as a proving ground for future missionaries at home and overseas. In the early days, one student became a missionary to Birmingham with Black Evangelistic Enterprise. Another student was a missionary to Nigeria.

The school has also served as a training

ground for pastors and teachers. Instructors who once taught at LABTS have gone on to teach at noted schools such as Moody Bible Institute, Biola University, Talbot Theological Seminary, Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and The Master's Seminary. "Teaching at LABTS in its first two years was

a spiritual highlight in my own growth and ministry," wrote a professor of Bible at Moody Bible Institute a number of years ago.

The stated purpose of the school at the beginning was "to give students sound, fun-

damental Bible teaching which will enable them to rightly divide the word of God and to minister it to the needs of their own neighborhoods and on the mission field." By God's grace that is still the purpose of LABTS. What an amazing heritage!

## LIBRARY EXPANSION

The Alonzo E. Levert Library was recently expanded by approximately 2,000 books. LABTS was the recipient of the theological library of the late Eric (Rick) Shaver. Rick, a teacher at Grace Bbible Institute in Long Beach, went home to be with the Lord in 2002

and left behind a library of almost 5,000 books. It was his desire to have his substantial library available to and used by those in the inner-city who may not be able to afford the time or money for a full-time seminary education.

Jessica Renshaw, the remarried widow of Rick, was given the names of three organizations in Los Angeles. One church told her they

had no room for the library. Another organization did not respond to several messages. By God's providence, President Felix and his

wife Marlean met with Jessica, and both sides agreed that this was God's plan for this rich theological library. All that was left to do was to move the books to LABTS.

Moving day was March 27. President Felix prepared for the move by unloading six 4 feet

by 6 feet bookcases into forty-seven moving boxes. He was assisted in moving the library to LABTS by administrators Art Morgan and Ivory Williams, and current student James Anderson.

It is with eager anticipation that LABTS looks forward to the day when these books are made available to its students. Please pray that the library will be-

come fully functional for Fall 2007. Student Edith Williams is volunteering a significant amount of time to make this a reality.

The Los Angeles Bible Training School and its Alumni Association are cosponsoring the annual Harvest Banquet. The banquet will be held on Saturday, October 27, at 6:00 p.m., at The Proud Bird Restaurant in Los Angeles.

The speaker for the

occasion will be Dr. John Perkins, president of the John M. Perkins Foundation for Reconciliation and Development. Perkins is a sharecropper's son who grew up in Mississippi amidst dire poverty. He fled to California when he was 17 and vowed never to return after his older brother's murder at the hands of a town marshal. However, in 1960, after his conversion to Christianity, he returned to his boyhood home to share the gospel of Christ. His outspoken nature and support and leadership in civil rights demonstrations resulted in repeated harassment, imprisonment and beatings. Despite dropping out of school in the third grade, John Perkins has been recognized for his work by being awarded eight honorary doctorates. He is the author of nine books including A Quiet Revolution, Let Justice Roll Down, With Justice For All, Beyond Charity, He's My Brother, and A Time to Heal. He is an international speaker and a teacher on the issues of racial reconciliation, indigenous leadership development, and community development.
