

LABTS PROFESSORS CONTRIBUTE TO A BOOK ON SEXUAL PURITY



In April of 2006, the theme of a men's conference co-sponsored by LABTS and The Master's Seminary was "Maintaining Purity in an Impure World". Approximately 300 men gathered on a Friday and Saturday to consider this topic. As a result of the conference, it became apparent that the time had come for a book to be written that specifically addressed African American brothers who wanted victory in their personal battles for purity. In April 2008, Moody Press/Lift Every Voice released Secret Sex Wars: A Battle Cry for

Purity. Five of the seven authors that contributed chapters to this important book are instructors at LABTS.

Secret Sex Wars is geared toward African American Christian men, yet its principles are applicable to all Christians. Professors Anthony Kidd (Slaving the Fiery Beast: The Foundation for a Successful Battle Plan), Carl Hargrove (Fearing God When No One Else Would Know: A Battle Plan for Secret Temptation), Paul Felix (Living According to the Will of God: An Ancient Battle Plan for Purity), Robert Scott (Learning from Men Who Have Fallen: A Flawed Battle Plan to Avoid), Victor Sholar (Living Free from the Slavery of Sexual Sin: A Battle Plan that Will Set You Free), and Pastors H. B. Charles (Putting Sin to Death: A Battle Plan to Win a War Unto Death) and Brian Kennedy (Training Our Sons to Overcome Sexual Temptation: A Battle Plan for Discipling Sons to Pursue Purity) have written a book that will make a real difference in the pursuit of holiness in the area of one's sexuality. A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT - "TRIALS"

In the last few months, God has brought a couple of "trials" into the Felix family. This is not unusual, since James, the half-brother of the Lord Jesus, informed believers they should expect trials. He said consider it all joy, **when** (not if) you encounter various trials (James 1:2). On September 23, 2007, my wife had a fall that damaged her cervical spine. She was in the hospital 5 days and was not able to work for 10 weeks. It was God's sovereign plan that Marlean have surgery on June 3. Through this ordeal we have been relying upon God's grace as we seek to respond to the trial properly.

Another "trial" came into our life on June 27. It lasted until July 6. During that time our daughter competed in the Olympic Trials in Eugene, OR. God enabled her to make the Olympic team by winning the 200 meters. I must admit I was more excited about the trials that Allyson was involved in rather than the one involving Marlean. Yet, from a spiritual viewpoint, God used Marlean's trial to make my wife and me more like Christ. After all, that is what a trial is all about!
