Carson St., Carson, 90745). In the past, the Harvest Banquet has always been a marvelous time of sweet fellowship as students and friends of LABTS renew their acquaintances. Dr. Crawford Loritts, Dr. John Perkins, Dr. Williams Banks, Dr. Alex Montoya, and others, have challenged the people of God with the Word of God at past Harvest Banquets.

Dr. Martin E. Hawkins is the speaker this year. He serves as president of the historic Southern Bible Institute in Dallas, which has been training men and women in the Word of God since 1927. In several ways, LABTS was patterned after SBI. It is affectionately known as the "Best Kept Secret in Dallas" and has prepared thousands of men and women for ministry in a variety of fields both locally and nationally. Dr. Hawkins became president of SBI in February of 2006. In 2005, our speaker retired as Assistant Pastor of Oak Cliff Bible Fellowship in Dallas (Dr. Tony Evans, Senior Pastor), after 29 years of dedicated service. Dr. Hawkins received his B.S. from Rutgers University (1971), M.A. from Rowan College (1973), and Th.M. and D.Min. from Dallas Theological Seminary (1980; 2000). He has been married to his wife Shirley for many years and God has blessed their union with two adult children, Martin Jr. and Melissa.

A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

The journey of earning my Doctor of Theology degree finally culminated on May 8, 2010. The packed sanctuary of Grace Community Church witnessed the graduation of 85 students from The Master's Seminary. The last name called was "Paul W. Felix." It's possible that my name was last because the journey took me approximately 11 years (ministry, family, etc., kept me quite busy!). Regardless, I was glad to hear it and to celebrate the occasion with family and friends.

My beautiful wife of 34 years, Marlean, was a great encouragement along the way. If it were not for her patience and gracious spirit, I doubt if I would have made it. I was extremely grateful that my son, Wes, and my daughter, Allyson, were present. Also in attendance at the graduation was my mom, Susan Felix, who is 91, and my father-in-law, Dr. Whalen S. Jones, who is 101. Other family members (my brother Larry, my sister Susan, my sister-in-laws Eleanor, Ginger, and Melvina) were present.

After the graduation, my wife and I held a reception on the campus of Grace Community Church for approximately 300 friends. We bribed people into coming by offering them bar-b-que chicken, ribs, and beef that were prepared by the best caterers in town, Edward and Ruby Ewell. It was good to have many personal friends there and to have present members from Baldwin Hills Baptist Church, Believers Bible Church, Los Angeles Community Bible Church, and Westside Bible Church.

It was very, very, special to have the students (past and present) and faculty of LABTS in attendance. They often prayed for me that I would finish the course. Art Morgan and Ivory Williams went beyond the call of duty and fulfilled many of my responsibilities as I worked on my dissertation. I am so grateful for the support of these two men.

I wrote my dissertation on *The Style of James*. I examined the vocabulary, grammar and syntax, literary devices, and literary influences of the author of James and demonstrated how it aids in solving textual and exegetical problems in this practical letter. It was approximately 400 pages long and had 903 footnotes, 130 tables, and 23 charts.
