

CO-FOUNDER DR. J. VERNON McGEE

President Felix prepared the following article for the newsletter of Thru the Bible Radio. A form of it will appear in their November edition.

The chancellor of the Los Angeles Bible Training School, Dr. Alonzo Levert, commented: "The greatest human benefactor and supporter that LABTS had was the late Dr. J. Vernon McGee, one of our co-founders. He was the instrument used of God to help us organize and develop this institution."

LABTS was organized in 1962 with the purpose of bringing systematic Bible teaching to south Los Angeles. In 1975, Dr. McGee appealed to his listeners to support a building project on behalf of LABTS. God's people responded to the appeal and subsequently an excellent classroom building was constructed and dedicated in the summer of 1977.

Dr. McGee's confidence and investment in LABTS were not in vain. Over the last five years, the student body has averaged in the neighborhood of 300. Each student goes "through the Bible" and is also taught the major doctrines of the Bible. LABTS alumni

are strengthening local churches in the greater L. A. area and even in other states. Some have gone to the mission fields of Africa, Philippines, Dominican Republic, Nova Scotia, etc. Others are involved in significant ministries like Child Evangelism Fellowship, Christian Released Time Education, and the Union Rescue Mission. God continues to honor the goal of preparing the people of God for the work of God in the world of God by teaching them the word of God.

In the early days of the school, staff members of the Church of the Open Door, where Dr. McGee was the pastor, served as regular members of the faculty. The heritage of excellent Bible teachers continues today. Current faculty members are also teaching at Azusa Pacific University, Biola University, The Master's College, and The Master's Seminary. In addition, the professors are actively involved in the local church and some serve as pastor-teachers.

In 2012, LABTS will celebrate 50 years of ministry! Pray that God will continue to build upon the rich foundation laid by Dr. J. Vernon McGee and other faithful men of God. Visit www.labts.org to learn more about this institution that God has favored throughout the years.

Did You Know?

- Dr. McGee and his wife were honorary members of the Los Angeles Bible Church, which met at LABTS. Floyd Johnson, current Chairman of the LABTS Board, was their "pastor."
- More than \$300,000.00 was raised in the mid-seventies as a result of the appeal to the Thru the Bible Radio (TTBR) audience to build classrooms for LABTS. This was the only time an appeal for gifts was made for a ministry besides TTBR on its broadcast.
- Church of the Open Door was known for supporting missions worldwide. Its pastor, Dr. McGee, believed it was hypocritical to neglect the mission field in its own backyard.

HARVEST BANQUET 2011

The speaker this year is Dr. Dolphus Weary, the president of Rural Education and Leadership (R.E.A.L.) Christian Foundation in Richland, Mississippi. He was born and raised in Mississippi. At the age of 17 he committed his life to Christ at a tent revival meeting sponsored by John Perkins, the founder of Voice of Calvary Ministries. Upon his graduation from High School, he attended Piney Woods Junior College and then attended Los Angeles Baptist College (currently known as The Master's College) on a basketball scholarship. He and another African American student were the first African Americans to attend Los Angeles Baptist College in 1967.

Dr. Weary earned a Masters of Religious Education from Los Angeles Baptist Theological Seminary, a Masters in Educational Administration from the University of Southern Mississippi, and a Doctor of Ministry from Reformed Theological Seminary (Jackson, MS).

The speaker and his wife Rosie are the parents of three children: Danita, who lives in Natchez, MS; Ryan, who is a

student at Belhaven College; and Reggie, who went home to be with the Lord in June 2004.

In 1990, Weary authored "I Ain't Comin' Back," which chronicles his life story. His intention on leaving Mississippi was to never come back, Yet, God had

other plans for him. His wife has also penned an autobiography entitled "Stepping Out from the Shadows."
