Yes, God is able! That was the simple, yet, profound message delivered by this year's speaker. Dr. Eddie B. Lane, Pastor of Bibleway Bible Church in Dallas, and Associate Professor of Pastoral Ministries at Dallas Theological Seminary, preached Daniel 3 in a fresh

way that challenged the listeners to consider anew the greatness of God. Pastor Lane is also the author of six books: The Single African American Christian; The African American Christian Family (Building Lasting Family Relationships); The African American Christian Parent (Parenting in the Context of

a Spiritual Deficit); The African American Christian Man; The African American Christian Woman; The Cattle on a Thousand Hills (Learning to Pray Effectively). The audience of approximately 525 people was truly blessed by this man of God!

The evening began with a welcome by President Felix and prayer by Instructor Dr. Paul Thorsell. Those in attendance joined their hearts in singing two favorite hymns, "To God be the Glory" and "Blessed Assurance," under the direction of 2003-2004 Student Body President, Michael Spencer. Before dinner was served, the instructors, Board members, stu-



dents, and graduates were acknowledged. After a good meal, Art Morgan, Assistant to the President, presented the highlights of the past year. Then, Mr. Tommie Harris, a 2004 graduate who is still taking classes, and Ms. Yolonda Carroll, a current student and the Student Body

Secretary, shared the impact that LABTS has had upon their lives as students. A generous offering was raised after Dr. Alonzo Levert, former President of LABTS and current board member, challenged the people to support the school. The hearts of God's people were prepared for the message by both instrumental and gospel

music. Ner de Leon, a former student, blessed those in attendance with his saxaphone rendition of Via Dolorosa. Dr. Lane was introduced by long-time friend, Dr. Ronald E. Roberts, pastor of Baldwin Hills Baptist Church. After the message, graduate Ruth Davis and her group, the Mountain Climbers, sang about the glories of heaven in a song entitled, "Heaven". LABTS Announces Spring 2005 Semester

Twelve classes have been announced for the Spring 2005 semester. The Monday morning classes will be **Doctrine II** (Carl Hargrove) and **Jeremiah** (Bennie Ross). The classes being presented on Monday night are **Old Testament Survey II** (Glen Sykes), **Christian Marriage and Family** (Anthony Kidd), **Acts** (Anthony Tetrow), and **Expository Preaching II** (George Moore). The Thursday day classes will be **New Testament Survey II** (Calvin Sills) and **Ecclesiology** [Doctrine of the Church] (Frederick Stanfield). The Thursday evening classes are **Doctrine III** (Victor Sholar), **Bible Study Methods** (Bobby Scott), **Epistles of John** (Cory Rogers), and **Hebrews** (Paul Felix). Day classes meet from 10:15 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and evening classes from 7:00 p.m. to 9:20 p.m.

The dates for registration are January 17 and 20, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The semester begins on Monday, January 24 and ends on Thursday, May 19. No tuition is charged for the classes. There is a registration fee of \$30.00 that will allow a student to take a maximum of four classes per semester. There is also an additional cost for textbooks. The five of us sat in the stands and watched my daughter, Allyson, win the silver medal in the 200m. Obviously, that was a thrilling time. It was also very exciting to do some sightseeing while in Athens and to visit the place where the apostle Paul proclaimed to the Athenians "the unknown God" (Acts 17:22-34). A week after our return from Athens, I laid in a hospital bed and my wife and I were told that I had experienced a heart attack.
