Instructor Anthony Kidd, who was recently installed as the new pastor of Westside Bible Church, offered prayer. Alumnus Michael Spencer led the attendees in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" and "O, How I Love Jesus".

What an encouragement these songs were to those present. Before dinner was served, graduates, students (current and past), instructors, and Board members were acknowledged and introduced.

FALL 2006 SEMESTER

The Fall 2006 semester is rapidly coming to an end. It has been a good semester. Once again LABTS has experienced the faithfulness and goodness of God. The faculty was entrusted with almost 300 students — 293 to be exact. Eleven classes were offered on the main campus and one class at the extension site in Ontario. The class in Ontario met for the first time on Thursday night rather than Saturday morning.

The following are the particulars regarding the classes for the Fall semester: Discipleship (Instructor James Borror, 41 students, Monday morning); 2 Peter, Jude (Instructor Bennie Ross, 18 students, Monday morning); Old Testament Survey I (Instructor Victor Sholar, 51 students; Monday night); Romans (Instructor Anthony Tetrow, 46 students, Monday night); Ecclesiology (Instructor Anthony Kidd, 29 students, Monday night); Biblical Counseling (Instructor Carl Hargrove, 35 students, Monday night); Revelation I (Instructor Frederick Stanfield, 32 students, Thursday morning); Galatians (Instructor Calvin Sills, 29 students, Thursday morning); Old Testament Survey I (Instructor Emory Davis, 12 students, Thursday

night - Ontario); **Doctrine III** (Instructor Paul Thorsell, 32 students, Thursday night); **Hermeneutics** (Instructor Paul Felix, 50 students, Thursday night); **Philippians** (Instructor George Hurtt, 17 students, Thursday night).

God continues to use the Chapel time in the lives of those attending LABTS. The messages have primarily been delivered by the faculty. The students have also been exposed to the ministries of Christian Released Time Education, Child Evangelism Fellowship, Biblical Ministries Worldwide (missions) Partnership Bible Outreach International (convalescent), Have Christ Will Travel (missions), and the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism.

The Student Body is involved in a number of ministries. The majority of students faithfully serve in their local church as leaders, teachers, etc. A number of them are also involved in ministries outside of the "four walls" of the church. Each student is encouraged to render at least one hour per week in Christian service. One of the students, Deanna Curls, recently authored 2 books on Christian living.

CLASSROOM FOCUS: Biblical Counseling - Carl Hargrove, Teacher



Description: The course is designed to help Christians grow in their Godgiven ability (Rom 15:14) to support others in the body with a biblical perspective on life's challenges and decisions. It involves encouraging counsel in view of sin and its im-

pending consequences; discerning thinking and behavior that God wants to change, and using God's Word authoritatively and confidently to change thinking and behavior. The course investigates the unbiblical alternatives that the world offers, and contrasts them with a thoroughly biblical approach. It will teach students to gather data, discover the underlining issues behind behavior, how to relate to people in need, provide hope, and assign effective homework.

Textbook: *Competent to Counsel*, Jay Adams. It provides an excellent foundation for those who want to learn the key elements of biblical counseling. It is readable and application oriented.

Goals: Encourage students to be more involved with those in the body of Christ. Rid the students of any suspicion that one has to be a professional to counsel.

Why take this class: We all know someone who is in need of counseling. We need to counsel ourselves at times (Psa 42/43). This course will help you fulfill the "one anothers" of Scripture better; especially the call to bear burdens, encourage, and admonish

Why you enjoy teaching this class: I enjoy teaching people how to help others. The course is extremely practical—it deals with everyday life issues. It is a "rubber meets the road" type of course. I also enjoy teaching how theology is fleshed out in the life of the church.
